Dear Parents, Children and Tournament Players,

We are pleased to inform you of the Club's plans for the coming year, 2010/11.

Saturday afternoons

The club will be open every Saturday afternoon during term time at the **ETNA Community Centre, 13 Rosslyn Road, Twickenham TW1 2AR**, with the session running from 14.00 to 17.00.

We will usually have three experienced coaches present:- James Coleman, Marie Gallagher and myself. Our aim will be to provide an educational, stimulating and enjoyable experience through a mixture of coaching and playing activities. The sessions will be suitable for children from 7 to 16 years old and will be divided according to age and ability. Participants should know the rules of the game and be playing regularly either at school or at home to obtain the maximum benefit.

We recognise that a 3-hour session can be quite demanding, particularly for younger children. We take a relaxed attitude to time-keeping, so please feel free to arrive a bit later or leave a bit earlier. As a rough guide, the first hour is usually devoted to coaching, the second hour to playing a serious game, and the final hour to fun activities. Parents are welcome to stay and observe the sessions, but please do not feel under any obligation to do so.

Our dates for 2010/11 will be as follows:

Autumn Term: September 4th 2010 to December 4th 2010 inclusive,
with a special event on December 11th 2010

Spring Term: January 8th 2011 to April 2nd 2011 inclusive

Summer Term: April 30th 2011 to July 9th 2011 inclusive

On Saturday December 11th 2010, the club will organise a trip to the **London Chess Classic** (www.londonchessclassic.com) at Kensington Olympia. This is a unique opportunity for club members to see some of the world's best chess players in action, including World Champion Vishy Anand from India, world ranked #1 19 year-old Magnus Carlsen from Norway, Vladimir Kramnik from Russia (the man who defeated Garry Kasparov!), alongside the top British players. As well as being able to watch the competition, there will also be coaching sessions, lectures and opportunities to play. Again, entry will be free to Richmond club members. The ETNA Centre will not be open on December 11th.

Tuesday evenings – Richmond Junior Chess Club at Twickenham Prep School (TPS)

The club also runs sessions on Tuesday evenings during term time, taking place at: **Twickenham Prep School, Beveree, 43 High Street, Hampton, Middlesex TW12 2SA**. We meet from 17.15 to 18.45 (**please note this has changed from 2009/10**). The club is grateful for the considerable support we receive from Twickenham Prep School. Children attending TPS should contact the school directly to enroll. The dates for the Autumn term are September 7th to December 14th inclusive, excepting October 19th, October 26th and November 9th – a total of 12 sessions. Spring term dates are January 11th to March 29th, excepting February 22nd (11 sessions). Summer term dates are May 3rd to June 21st inclusive, excepting May 31st (7 sessions).

Competitions

We know that many of our members enjoy playing in individual competitions and representing the Club in team competitions. We also recognise that one of the best ways for young players to develop their chess skills is to take part regularly in competitions. We have therefore expanded our programme of competitive events this year as follows:

1) Blitz tournaments

We will organise two **blitz tournaments** each term. These will now take place on Saturday afternoons and will run alongside our normal club sessions. Everyone will be encouraged to take part in these tournaments and there will be cash prizes on offer. These tournaments will be open to non-members and entry will be free to Richmond club members.

The blitz tournament dates will be:

Autumn Term:	September 25th 2010 and October 16th 2010
Spring Term:	January 22nd 2011 and March 5th 2011
Summer Term:	May 21st 2011 and June 18th 2011

2) Richmond Junior Chess Club Championship

This will include a qualifying competition for the UK Chess Challenge Megafinal and will take place over three afternoons in the Spring term (January 8th, January 29th and February 12th). Once again, entry is included within your membership fees. The winners in each age group will receive trophies and the title of RJCC Champion.

3) London Junior Chess Championship qualifying competition

We will host an LJCC qualifying competition at Twickenham Prep School on Saturday October 2nd 2010. Club members can play in this event at a reduced entry fee. The ETNA Centre will be open as usual on that date.

4) Junior Four Nations Chess League (4NCL)

We will field teams in the Under 18, Under 14, Under 11 and Under 9 competitions, which will be played in Oxford on the weekends 13th/14th November 2010, 5th/6th February 2011 and 9th/10th April 2010. This competition attracts some of the best players and coaches in the UK and gives players in the Under 18 section an opportunity to gain an International rating.

5) English Primary Schools Chess Association (EPSCA)

We will again enter the Under 11 and Under 9 competitions.

6) We also hope to arrange more ad hoc matches against other clubs or schools.

The club still maintains connections with the Richmond Rapidplay tournaments and would encourage all club members to consider playing in these events. More details can be found at www.surreyrapidchess.org.

I'd like to thank everybody for their support last year and I hope that the club will continue to go from strength to strength. RICHMOND JUNIOR CHESS CLUB HOME-CLUB AGREEMENT

RJCC is committed to the safety and welfare of the children in the club. All our coaches have been CRB (Criminal Records Bureau) checked.

THE CLUB WILL:-

- Provide sets, boards, clocks and other material necessary for the playing of Chess.
- Provide an atmosphere conducive to the playing and study of Chess at a level appropriate to the age and ability of the Member.
- Oppose behaviour by anybody in the Club that limits the ability of others to play and enjoy their chess, and seek to create an environment that is disciplined and supportive and in which individuals respect each other.
- Oppose and address bullying, harassment or abuse whether motivated racially or in any other way.
- Contact parents with regard to any problems concerning their children's behaviour or attitude.
- Be available at all times to speak to parents/guardians with regard to their children's progress and ability at chess, and all other matters concerning their Club membership.
- Maintain a Child Protection Policy and appoint Child Protection Officers. The CPP and contact details of the CPOs will be available on the Club website.

AS A PARENT/GUARDIAN I WILL:-

- Guarantee that my Child is aware of the importance of a high standard of behaviour and the need to respect other people, and the Club premises and equipment.
- Encourage my Child by providing the opportunity to play and study Chess regularly, to compete in tournaments and to represent the Club in team competitions if selected.
- Support the Club's disciplinary requirements as a necessary backdrop to the successful teaching of Chess in a Club environment.
- Accept reasonable sanctions and disciplinary measures taken by the Club in the event of a misdemeanour involving my Child.
